WHAT DOES IT COST?

Care is provided to those who are eligible. There are no charges, no bills sent to you and no insurance forms to fill out.

WHO CAN RECEIVE CARE?

You will need to meet with a counselor in order to determine your eligibility. We urge you to call us (610.836.5990 x 122) to see how we can help you, or if necessary, we can refer you to other community resources.

HOW DOES IT BENEFIT OUR COMMUNITY?

Community Volunteers in Medicine is staffed by doctors, nurses, medical specialists, dentists, dental hygienists, social workers and pharmacists who are licensed in the state of Pennsylvania.
